INTRODUCTORY RESIDENCY GUIDE FOR SHORT-TERM STUDY

The CENTRE FOR THE STUDY OF SUBSTRUCTURED LOSS is now accepting applications for residency programming commencing in 2018. Artists, researchers, and other arts professionals are encouraged to apply.

ORGANIZATION:

Established in 2009, the CENTRE FOR THE STUDY OF SUBSTRUCTURED LOSS is a Canadian organization dedicated to the development of applied grief and bereavement research. Documented through the use of practice-led methods within art and comprised of work from an interdisciplinary network of creative and technical practitioners; the CENTRE is committed to the advancement of the arts and sciences; providing programming in support of education; public and professional engagement; and the development of field research in partnership with local, national, and international academic bodies, institutions, foundations, and non-profits.

RESIDENCY PROGRAM:

Established in 2011, the residency program encourages experimentation and the development of multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary studio work grounded in research within grief, bereavement, and adjacent processes.

The program aims to provide working artistic professionals with a platform for research, production, and supports emerging and established artistic professionals/researchers working in any medium and/or discipline. The work can encompass and explore varying physical and emotional processes (or loss) that people undergo.

Residents can continue with existing projects or undertake new research; an undertaking that may lead to expanded possibilities, collaboration, a broader network, or possibly, new works.

Previous residents and collaborators have undertaken both theoretical-historical and practice-led projects working with, but not limited to the following subject matter: the aging process and the elderly, cancer, sex work and sexual assault, miscarriage, suicide, mental illness, spousal and familial loss etc.

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PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY:

The residency is open to artists, researchers, and other professionals from any country. The selection process is based on the merits and quality of artistic practice. The program is not available to students.

RESIDENCY STRUCTURE:

Residency programming is one or two months in duration.

Brief presentation period follows the one month residency programming structure.

The CENTRE provides mentorship and guidance throughout the creative development process including iteration, subject-specific research, presentation of works, as well as, access to local resources and administrative support.

1 Residents should allot one week total for the presentation period during the one month residency programming structure as additional time maybe necessary for de-installation of works, conclusion of programming etc. The presentation period commences directly after the conclusion of residency programming.
2 Presentation period only follows the one month residency programming structure. Please consider the one month: Berlin, Germany (Summer 2018); Berlin, Germany (Autumn 2018); or London, United Kingdom (Autumn 2018) programming cohorts if a presentation period is of personal and professional interest.

LIVING & WORKING ENVIRONMENT:

The CENTRE will arrange for shared studio, workshop facilities, or office desk space for the duration of programming. The workspace will be located within a studio facility shared by other artists and working professionals. The environment will allow participants to engage in public conversations and cultivate dialogue with local artists and professionals.

Presentation space is provided for the one month residency programming structure.

Participants are expected to bring their own computer and other tools necessary for their work during the residency.

The CENTRE does not cover the costs of travel related to the guest's arrival or departure, living/housing expenses (living space is not provided - studio facilities are work-only), production materials, presentation of works, or the shipping of materials of any artworks or objects produced or collected during the residents stay.

Successful candidates are encouraged to apply for additional funding if necessary.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE:

We accept applications in English only, to accommodate our international jury members. However, language proficiency is not a criteria for evaluation by the jury unless it directly relates to the chosen discipline/practice. Applications are assessed and chosen by a jury on the basis of merit, compatibility, and the ability the CENTRE has to support the proposed research or project - as such, if unsuccessful we encourage follow-up submissions.

The application form and all applicable attachments must be submitted by email.

Incomplete applications will not be considered.

An additional residency guide will be sent to participating residents before the commencement of programming.

London, United Kingdom Residency Fee (1 Month Program): £579 (GBP)

1 Fees listed are net charges. Additional currency, bank, and transfer charges may apply.
2 Fees are to be paid in full at minimum four (4) calendar weeks prior to residency start date or an applicants place in the program is forfeited and the next applicable candidate is selected from the waitlist.
3 Given the large administrative scale involved in planning programming - refunds will not be given if applicants cancel and fees are non-transferable.
